

List of Wesleyan Courses that satisfy the criteria as an English Language and Literature Pre-Requisite for the Health Professions (HP)

For the English pre-requisite, English must be the spoken and written language for the discussion and written assignments for the two courses completed. The primary content of an English Language course must be either “**Literature Based**”, “**Creative Writing**” or “**Composition and Rhetoric**. At Wesleyan, there are a number of courses that do not have the ENGL prefix that can be designated as an English course based on this “designation”, including some First Year Seminars. A main component of a course that you may be considering as an ENGL pre-requisite course for an HP is that the course includes **discussion and/or persuasive presentations (demonstrating your ability to use language effectively and communicate ideas clearly) and entails significant writing assignments; consisting of at least three or more essays, short papers, critiques, weekly reaction papers or weekly blogs.** You may use the courses below as a comparison for a chosen course that is not on this list. If you still feel uncertain about the courses you have chosen to satisfy the ENGL requirement for your application, you may send the Health Professions Advisor the course name, prefix (for example ENGL or AMST) and course number by email, the course will be reviewed and you will be provided feedback regarding whether the course can be designated ENGL: mrodriguez01@wesleyan.edu
